 - Royal Assent on 28 April 2022

 - Large tranche of Statutory Instruments came into effect this month



Competence Steering Group

- Steering Group on Competence for Building a Safer Future"
- Originally formed in July 2017 as a sub-group of the DLUHC (post-Grenfell) Industry Response Group
- Became the Competence working group for the Hackitt Review
- Reformed in May 2018 to implement *Building A Safer Future* proposals (day before report was published)
- Engages around 400 people and 150+ organisations from:
 - Fire Safety
 - Construction and Built Environment
 - Owners and Managers
- £13m+ resource contributed from industry
- ➢ 67 meetings of the CSG between May '18 and December '23
- Several hundred meetings of 12 working groups plus various T&F groups

SETTING **THE BAR** A NEW COMPETENCE **REGIME FOR BUILDING** A SAFER FUTURE



Achievements

- Statutory Industry Competence Committee now established in the Building Safety Regulator
- WG0 led to a National suite of competence standards through BSI Flex 8670 and transition to a full British Standard.
- **PAS standards** for the **three regulated roles** (PC, PD and <u>**BSM**</u>) now published as PAS 8671, PAS 8672 and PAS 8673
- Approvement in principle for further PAS Standards (Construction Products and Fire Risk Assessors)
- The BSA is about to publish BSAS 01:2023 Organisation Capability Management System Standard – Managing Competence (to be taken up by BSI for development as a PAS alongside the existing series)
- Framework of Competence Standards providing specific requirements for individual disciplines
- Arrangements for independent assessment and reassessment against the competence standards
- Establishment of the **Building Safety Alliance**
- Development of Safety Case/Safety Management Systems



Common themes from Working Groups

- Underpinned by Standards: Three of the WGs already have PASs in place and another two have permission to develop PASs with a further proposal in the pipeline
- All WGs have developed complete or partial competency frameworks
- Publication of c30 guides and key information
- Progress slowed by time constraints on volunteer input
- Need for more awareness of competence requirements in every sector
- Lack of legislative clarity
- Need for more collaborative approaches
- Gaps and duplications between WGs to be explored
- New sectors to be investigated

Future

- CSG has become the Industry Competence Steering Group (ICSG)
- Secretariat transferred from the Construction Industry Council (CIC) to the Building Safety Regulator (BSR) as a sub-set of the Industry Competence Committee
- Working Groups to continue to function where appropriate and to be managed by the industry
- Hanna Clarke (CPA) and Gill Hancock (APM) are the new chair and deputy chair



Building Control

- Regime change on 6 April 2024
- CICAIR ceased to function on 31 March
- Transitional arrangements for Als for a further 6 months (overseen by the HSE)
- New Registers for Building Control Approvers and Building Inspectors opened on 5 April
