STA Training – Installer Training Scheme

The home for the new Installer Training Scheme (ITS) formerly known as TFCAS designed around 4 key principles:

- **Simplified** reducing the complex steps from registration to certification.
- Accessible single point of entry registration and logging on process with access to anytime/anywhere online training on a range of devices.
- Credible supported by AI technology to provide scheme assurance during testing.
- Affordable no additional cost to STA members/learners.
- The home for future schemes and online/CPD type training.




STA TRAINING



Installer Training Scheme (ITS)—The Process

- 1. Register for the ITS via the STA Skills Hub.
- 2. Log in via the STA Learning Portal.
- 3. Use the online learning resources (training manual/mock exam) as required dependent on knowledge/experience level.
- 4. Complete the AI proctored final examination.
- 5. Receive ITS completion certificate

Next steps for STA skills and training

- Introduce further STA training schemes including:

- Continue to inform the content of sector National Occupational Standards and qualifications.
